

- 2. Samantha's brother and his best friend decide to open a club and convince Samantha to become a third partner. What do you think of those dynamics?
- 3. The scene in front of the restaurant where Samantha loses her parking spot and the scene with the biker dude sending her that drink she didn't want. The way those scenes played out, would you have been brave enough to do somethings like that?
- 4. The introduction to Andrew at the club by her brother and Gabe. Do you think that since they knew her personally, they could have handled it better? Maybe set a mock interview or even a dinner meet and greet so Samantha could feel like she was a part of the process?
- 5. Though gender roles are shifting with the passage of time, it is still more common to find men at the helm of most businesses. When Andrew was hired without Samantha's approval, do you think there was an innate sexism on their part?

- 6. Samantha is immediately reluctant to accept Andrew as a meaningful employee of the club and despite seeing his success on the first night of DJ'ing. Do you think it was his introduction to her as a "surprise" employee that bothers her? Or was there an immediate, initial attraction that caused that?
- 7. Given Samantha's experience of owning and managing a business, do you think that her continued reluctance to develop a deeper relationship with Andrew stemmed from a history of unfulfilling relationships? Or was it caused by an underlying understanding of the pitfalls of having a romance with someone she is employing?
- 8. Music is such a big part of the book and it's what eventually led Samantha to let down her guard. Do you think subconsciously Andrew knew that was the way to get to her to at least get her to talk to him?
- 9. The scene with Andrew after the club was closed and locked. Do you believe that Samantha acted intentionally? Or was it an act of fate and exactly what was needed to push them together?
- 10. Andrew first believes that Samantha and Jonathan are poking fun at him because he is English. Do you think many immigrants feel vulnerable in this way when adapting to a new culture and interacting with new people? Why or Why not?

- 11. What did you think of the power dynamics between Andrew and Samantha? Their relationship begins with Samantha having more control simply by being his boss. Does the entrance into a romance shift who has the more dominant role in their relationship?
- 12. When Andrew invited Samantha to the set and Samantha noticed Nvette flirting with him. Do you think that Samantha then knew Nvette was going to be trouble?
- 13. Both Samantha and Andrew experienced the death of a loved one. How do you think their losses helped to shape their futures?
- 14. After the incident, when Samantha walks into Andrew's apartment, after she thought he betrayed her, she finds out the events that really happened to cause the break up. Do you think it was right for Samantha to hold that knowledge from Andrew as long as she did?
- 15. What do you think of the promises Andrew made to Samantha about their relationship? When reading it, did you think these were believable promises or just talk? Do you think these promises exaggerated Samantha's reaction when she felt betrayed by Andrew or do you think it will make Samantha gullible for future betrayal if they stay together?


